Ask somebody to time you whilst you see how many hops/jumps/star jumps you can do in 1 minute.	Draw a picture of your bedroom and label the things in it (use your Fred fingers to help you spell the words)	Make the most interesting model you can using a cereal box!	Use all of the socks in your sock drawer to make 'sock pairs'. Can you count up in 2's to see how many socks you have?	When you are outside on a walk, take some photographs of some of the things that you spot (make sure you ask permission from your grown up first!)	Use Skype / Zoom / FaceTime to have a chat with a friend or family member that you don't live with.
Get three pieces of string or wool and see if you can make a friendship bracelet by tying a knot at the end and then plaiting the pieces together.	Help to write the shopping list for your family (use your Fred Fingers to help you spell the words)	Make a Lego model of your house.	Draw a picture of all of the Numberblocks from 1 to 10. Can you remember all of their colours?	Create a Tool Box Treasure Box. (ask a grown-up first) Collect together some kitchen utensils and investigate how they work, what they are made from and what they are used for.	Do 5 helpful things for somebody else in your family.
Practise doing buttons up and undoing buttons. Practise doing up zips. How quickly can you do these activities?	Write a set of instructions on how to wash your hands. You could also draw pictures.	Paint a portrait of your whole family (you could look at a photograph to help you)	Make some cakes (make sure you ask for help!) You could practise weighing the ingredients and counting the cake cases.	Can you find things that spin? E.g. empty plastic bottle, wheel, coin	Make a card for somebody in your family. (You could even post it if it is for somebody you don't live with!)
Take a pretend trip to a jungle and jump over logs, duck under branches, walk through a swamp, tiptoe past a snake etc.	Choose one of your favourite books and look for digraphs. How many can you spot? Can you read the words?	Build a rocket! You could use toilet rolls or construction kits.	Draw around your hand and then carefully cut it out. You could then use it to measure how long/tall things are.	Have you planted any seeds? Perhaps you could keep a growing diary and draw pictures or take photographs of your plants as they grow.	Play a board game with your family, taking it in turns to have a go. (Make sure you say well done to the winner!)
Ask a grown up for a piece of string. Can you tie a knot in it? How many knots can you tie?	Where can you find writing? Look around your house/or on a walk. Can you read the words?	Make your own music, learn to dance or sing a song and then perform it for your family.	Using duplo or lego can you build towers from 1-10 or even taller? How tall can you go?	Portrait challenge! Choose someone in your family. Ask them politely to sit very still while you draw just their face.	Make a 'proud cloud'. Perhaps you could take a photograph of a model, picture or write about something you are proud of.
