Teddy – has been doing lots of mindfulness activities, such as clay modelling, painting, reading and playing his guitar. He also found time to build himself a Roman shield!

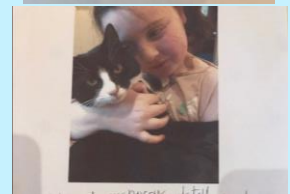
Teddy's sunflower is now a huge
