the best individual score! Very well done to everyone for keeping active during


lockdown and for representing the school so well.



It is about twins Arthur and Rosie, who, when they were younger, invented an imaginary world called The Land of Roar – but now they are older and have mostly forgotten all about it. As the story gets going, the twins are 11, and strange happenings make them wonder if the Land of Roar really does exist... Expect dragons, fights, magic, adventures, and mysterious animals, and you won't be disappointed.
