Rationale for learning

Family holiday traditions are important because they connect family members who may be separated by distance, working different schedules, or just busy with sports, school or jobs. Research shows that these traditions help us to remain close to our family members and create a connection between our past and the future. It is for this reason that it is important to understand where many of these traditions originated. Many of our Christmas customs began long before Jesus was born. They came from earlier festivals, which had nothing to do with the Christian church. Long time ago people had midwinter festivals when the days were shortest and the sunlight weakest. In this topic, the children will discover the origins of many Christmas traditions and also explore celebratory customs associated with Christmas in various other countries.
